BIOGRAPHICAL SKETCH

Liz Stuart, OECTA President since July 1, 2017. First elected to the Provincial Executive in July 2014, Liz served as second vice-president from 2014-2015, and first vice-president from 2015-2017; now in her second term as president, which runs until June 30, 2021. A member of OECTA's provincial bargaining team since 2014; more than 20 years of teaching experience with the York Catholic District School Board, teaching all grades from JK-8. From 2002-2009, Liz was grievance officer for the York Unit, where she served as local president from 2009-2014, and acted as Chief Negotiator for local negotiations.

A strong labour activist, Liz has been particularly involved in issues that disproportionately affect women, including precarious work, pay equity, child care, and gender-based violence. Current CTF Vice-president; former OFL VP and former OFL Women's Committee member; CLC Canadian Council member; OTF Executive member and OTF Governor; member of QECO Affiliates Committee; Canadian Labour College board; and member of Partners Consultative Committee for OTPP; member of CTF Advisory Committee on the Status of Women, delegate to UNCSW, EI Women's Conference, and observer at EI World Congress. Liz's passion and determination serve as an agent of change for OECTA members and the broader community.
